An Argyllshire surname formerly current in Arran, and a common surname on tombstones in and around Knapdale. From its frequency on the Knapdale tombstones it has been suggested that the original Gorm may have been a Macmillan. It is a translation of Mac Ghilleghuirm. A writer in the Celtic monthly (XXIII, p. 207) erroneously suggests that the Blues of Colonsay, Gigha, and Campbeltown are probably descended from the Buies (a quite different name). One of the oldest family names of Jura. Donald Bleu in Torranbeg, 1755.
