**ARMS** Ermine shield a black chief on which there are three silver

bull's heads.

STURROCK. Laurentius Sturrok, chaplain in Aberdeen, 1448 is probably Laurence Sturrok, perpetual vicar of the parish church of Covil, 1453. Alexander Storrok held a fourth part of the ville of Craquhy near Dunnichen, 1509. John Storrock in Dundee was charged in 1676 with being a "schismatik and a disorderly person". Storach, Storrack, Storek, Sturrock are the same name originating in the pastoral districts of Angus, and said to mean literally sheep farmers or storemasters (farmers).
