STURROCK. Laurentius Sturrok, chaplain in Aberdeen, 1448 is probably Laurence Sturrok, perpetual vicar of the parish church of Covil, 1453. Alexander Storrok held a fourth part of the ville of Craquhy near Dunnichen, 1509. John Storrock in Dundee was charged in 1676 with being a "schismatic and a disorderly person". Storach, Storrack, Storek, Sturrock are the same name originating in the pastoral districts of Angus, and said to mean literally sheep farmers or storemasters (farmers).
