ARROL, Arrell.,Of local origin from Errol in Perthshire, one of the old spellings of which was Arroll. John Arrell in Aroqueybeg is recorded in 1556, and Duncan Errole was minister of Luss in 1590. Thomas Errole in Blairoule was a retainer of Stewart of Ardvorlik in 1592. Thomas Arroll in Arochibeg, Dumbartonshire, and Johnne Arroll in Cashile, were fined each 20 merks in 1614 for resetting members of the outlawed Clan Gregor. Ducan Arrell, codiner in Dumlegark, was put to death along with Macfarlanes of Kepnoch for raiding in 1619. Bessie Herreal is recorded in Frewche, parish of Glenylla, 1625. Duncan Arrell or Arroll, tailor and burgess, and Nicolas Arrile, barber, appear in Edinburgh in 1629 and 1653. John Arrel and Wiliam Arrell were burgesses of Stirling in 1646 and 1673. Sir William Arrol (1839-1913), engineer and bridge builder. Arrall, 1669.
